

USED UNIFORMS

The Used Uniform Program is run by volunteers from the PTSA. We collect donations, filter out pieces that aren't in shape to sell, mend what we can, and organize them for the next sale.

While we do raise some money for the PTSA, it's a service and a community builder. We charge \$10 for the skirts, \$5 for outerwear, and \$1 for the rest because we've found that more people are willing to "buy" a vintage skirt than take a free used one. Having said that, if this isn't in your budget this year and you need a skirt, always just ask. The goal for this program isn't the money as much as the community.

Frequently Asked Questions

When are the sales? Usually at 6th grade orientation and when we have enough supply. Our goal is to give entering students a chance to buy one but also to vary the times enough so that working parents and growing older students all get a chance to buy one. This is also why we limit families to 2 skirts per student. Obviously we can't police this, but please abide by it.

How many do we need? Most students are great with two skirts. They wear them over shorts usually and don't need daily washing.

Can I donate spirit wear, shoes, belts, etc? Always yes, but we have limited space. So please check it over for stains and wear. Those white shirts don't usually survive the year and it's time-consuming to sort them out.

This skirt is broken and stained, do you want it? Yes! This is the exception. Because the skirts are expensive, we try harder to salvage them and make keychains (for graduating seniors) out of the fabric if they can't be saved.

Can I still sell mine online or to a friend? Of course. It's yours. Whether you bought it new or from the PTSA sale, it's yours to keep. We hope you will consider donating it if you can, but it's yours.

Can I swap my skirt for a bigger (or smaller or different) one? Yes. Again, we hope you donate and buy if you can, giving the PTSA \$10. If you bought one without your child and find it doesn't work, don't feel bad about bringing it back if we have a better size available. But that's always an "if" and we don't have the bandwidth to keep track of who owes what.

What size fits my student? Nobody knows.

Dennis is the 3rd uniform supplier we have used. First was Parker, and then Lands' End. I'll post a size chart, but you can always alter your skirt and still donate it. The best way to determine size is to measure your student's waist right where the skirt will sit. If you don't have a fabric tape measure, use a string and a ruler. We have started labeling the skirts with waist measurements on the front to make things easier for sales. We have a wide range of sizes, so please ask.
